On Monday June 13th, Pat McNamara and Lochmor Golf Course will host HVGCSA members and their guests for a fun day out on the links. This meeting is also the qualifier for the Met Team Championship. HVGCSA members will compete for the right to represent the association at the annual Met event held every fall. The team will be comprised of eight golfers (4 gross and 4 net participants).

About Pat:

You can't talk about Pat without talking about the legacy of the McNamara family. If you look at the HVGCSA Directory, you'll notice the history. Father Ray, member since 1970. Brother Mike, member since 1978. And Pat, member since 1989. And, let's not forget brother Terry, who also was a HVGCSA member. At one point in time, all four McNamara's were superintendents at golf courses in Sullivan County. Collectively they were known as "McNamara's Band" or, my favorite description, the "Royal Family of the Catskills."

Pat was born in Barea, Ohio. Pat's dad Ray worked in the salt mines under Lake Erie. The family's stay in Berea didn't last long. Ray moved the family to Warren County, PA. so he could work on the construction of the Kinzua Dam. Located within the Allegheny National Forest, it is one of the largest dams in the U.S. east of the Mississippi River. It spans the Allegheny River.

When that project wound down, Ray moved the family to Ellenville, NY. Ray got a job working as a mechanic on the golf course at Homowack Lodge. In those days, there were many thriving resorts in the Catskills and most of them had golf courses. And they were jammed packed every summer with guests travelling up from NYC to spend a couple of weeks. The advent of Jet travel kind of doomed the Catskills as a vacation hotspot, but that's a story to be told at a different time.

Ray moved up through the ranks and took over as superintendent at the course. All the McNamara boys ended up working for dad as teenagers. "I started working for my dad at Homowack Lodge when I was 15," Pat reminisced, "it was string trimming and raking bunkers, just like it was for my brothers."

Pat's first superintendent's position was at The Pines Hotel and Resort. "The Pines had a 9-hole course. We took care of that and the ski hill in the winter." Pat stated.

After the Pines, Pat moved on to Swan Lake. It was a brief stay. Pat took a year off from golf to work as a logger. Then it was on to Apple Greens G.C. in New Paltz where he oversaw the opening of the front nine and grew in the back nine. Then it was back to logging.

Pat's next position was as the superintendent at Kutchers Resort where he took care of the course for 16 years. And nine years ago, Pat took over the superintendent's position for both Tarry Brae G.C. and Lochmor G.C. in South Fallsburg, N.Y.

Getting back to the McNamara family, what sustained them was the fact that they were close and hung together. And they would always pitch in and help each other out, and they still do to this day. "When Dad was still working, the four of us would get together once a week to play golf," Pat laughed, "we'd play in our work boots and drink beer afterwards."

So where are the McNamara's now? Ray is retired. Terry works as a cook in the NYS prison system. Mike is still taking care of the Grossinger's property, even though the course isn't open. And Pat, in addition to his gig at Tarry Brae and Lochmor, also has a company that does spray applications at other golf courses and properties. Mike occasionally will lend him a hand at those jobs.

When not working, Pat loves to ride his Harley Davidson motorcycle.



About Lochmor:

Both Tarry Brae and Lochmor were built in the late 1950's. The Architect for both courses was William Mitchell. He designed and renovated over 200 courses in the Eastern U.S. during his career.

Lochmor is a fun course to play. From the back tees, it's 6550 yards. It's a fair course that won't "beat you up" according to Pat.

Amazingly, Pat maintains both courses with a crew of 11. It's not by choice. "I could use three more guys," Pat laughed.

Pat looks forward to seeing a good turnout for the meeting!!



GOLF ETIQUETTE & RULES by Kevin Doyle



A lot has happened in the golf industry during and since the beginning of the pandemic. While it would be easy to go off on a diatribe about the many altered aspects, one difference stands out among the rest: Increased rounds have pumped life into many facilities.

With full memberships — and

even waiting lists — at some private clubs, to full teesheets, reduced outings, and increased revenue at daily fee facilities, golf is revitalized. Conversations with many GCSAA members have proven to me that this much needed increased engagement has come with a notably increased lack of etiquette. It doesn't matter what type of facility, there are more balls in the air. There are more swings being taken. More carts are finding their way on the property. Not all of these are beneficial. What can be done?

Increased rounds don't necessarily equate to more stories of staff under siege by flying golf balls. Simple math would prove that having more golfers and tighter tee-times does increase the number of opportunities for issues. Do the new and returning golfers deserve the blame for seeming additional instances of staff being hit or nearly hit by golf balls? There is no way to know, after all, it's a problem that existed when the game was struggling for players too.

Again, increased rounds mean more swings, more divots, and more ball marks. Some repaired by respectful golfers, many not. Tee markers, divot boxes, golf carts seem to have fallen target to more than their fair share of wayward golf club attacks. Unfortunately, the proper turf isn't always the target of these swings these days. Add to that list, the occurrence of divots taken out of greens and collars seem to be on the rise too. Learning of this unnecessary and unwanted damage through conversations has increased, and the prevalence of such despair on social media mirrors that up-tick too. None of this is new to our industry professionals, but the seeming growth of these occurrences have become alarming.

Golf cart traffic created an agronomic situation in recent years that has been difficult to address, most notably when they all were driven where they belonged. Wayward carts aren't anything new, yet more vehicles making their way on to the course seems to have increased the number of carts in undesirable situations. Harming turf, ropes, and carts does more than add work to superintendents, it damages the bottom line of the facility. Is the lack of etiquette part of the new golf culture? I sure hope not. It seemed to me that during the lean golf years, facilities were so thrilled to have players that many overlooked indiscretions in favor of revenue. I have heard about facilities now getting more aggressive in tracking down perpetrators of damage and holding them accountable. One facility has begun communications at every interaction point of the golf course. All staff are given scripts to tell every member/ customer the expectations and etiquette required during their round, no matter how many times they may have heard them.

Is a full-blown communication program going to fill every divot, fix every ball mark and keep every cart where it belongs? I highly doubt it, yet if it keeps your staff safer, it's a positive result. If the message delivered enlightens even just a few unaware golfers to embrace the etiquette that makes our game special, then it will have made a difference for the better.
