iver Vale Country Club to Host HVGCSA's April Meetin By: Kevin Collins

Superintendent Brian O'Malley will host the HVGCSA's April meeting at River Vale CC on Wednesday, April 12<sup>th</sup>. River Vale is a storied venue and a solid golf course with telltale hints of Donald Ross in its history and design. This may be the first trip to River Vale in the HVGCSA's history.

#### About Brian



Brian was born and raised in Denver, Colorado. Brian's dad Jake worked for United Airlines. "My dad grew up in Cleveland. He started working for United Airlines and eventually moved to Chicago to work for United at O'Hare Airport," Brian recalled, "Dad worked in food service and

later became a supervisor in the baggage department. My dad loved to ski. He had an opportunity to move to Denver with United and he took it. That's how he ended up in Colorado. It's also where he met my mom Lisa. She had moved to Denver from Oklahoma. They met on a blind date set up by a mutual acquaintance."

Brian was born in 1982. His brother Chris was born in 1983. They were joined at the hip and did everything together. They both shared a passion for golf. "In high school, I loved to play golf," Brian laughed, "I would play 12 hours a day. I caddied at Cherry Hill. I worked at a golf range. I worked at a pro shop. I did anything I could to be around it. Chris had that same love for the game."

Brian's first experiences on the maintenance side began at Murphy Creek Golf Course in Aurora, CO. "I worked on the course during the last part of the grow-in. The course opened when I was a senior in high school." Brian was hooked. He enrolled at Colorado State University to pursue a turf degree. His first internship was at Kukio Golf & Beach Club on the Big Island of Hawaii. "It was a grow-in. I remember blasting lava rock. It was information overload but well worth it."

Internships followed at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort in Farmington, PA (one-time home of the PGA's 84 Lumber Classic), Pelican Hill in Newport Beach, CA, and a post graduate internship at Saucon Valley CC in Upper Saucon Township, PA. Now it was time for his first paid position.

"My brother Chris was working for Greg James (Dr. Love) at Plainfield, CC," Brian explained, "Greg was moving on to grow-in Liberty National and there were some opportunities there so I went. I loved Greg. It was a good time in my life. Financially it was tough. There was no free housing. I was at Liberty for four years."

The adventure continued at Coco Beach. Brian worked the Puerto Rican Open down there. But, he had a hankering to go back to the Cleveland area where his dad grew up. "I did the Cleveland tour for three years at Westwood CC," Brian laughed, "You couldn't make any money there. And there wasn't a lot of opportunities. My brother Chris was working for Mike Scott at Wykagyl CC and he persuaded me to head back east. I had a brief stay at Scarsdale CC and then moved back to NJ working at Edgewood CC, first for Bob Wolverton and then Mike Scott. I enjoyed my time there. Both Bob and Mike were very hands-off which created a good work environment."

## WATERS OF THE UNITED STATES (WOTUS) CHANGES IN REGULATIONS

I don't enjoy passing along difficult messages, not many do. This is especially true when it comes to regulatory issues. Alas, here we are facing an old foe yet again. Waters of The United States (WOTUS) is an item that GCSAA's Government Affairs team and our Waters Advocacy Coalition have worked hard to both clarify and protect our industry against. Below are a couple resources regarding the changes in regulations that became active on March 20, 2023.

The Government Affairs team dropped a blog update in December 2022 updating the membership on many details. The blog post can be found here: <u>"Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) rule represents missed opportunity to clarify federal water regulation (gcsaa.org)</u>.

The short version is that the EPA is reverting to the extremely robust regulatory version during the Obama administration. Issues that would create harm to the golf industry revolve around "operations that are on, over or near potential waters of federal jurisdiction", and "significant nexus." With Federal jurisdiction reaching all the way to ephemeral streams, it becomes more unclear what areas of golf courses *might* be under federal jurisdiction. Add to it, deciding whether tributaries, wetlands, and other waters are under federal jurisdiction are near impossible for superintendents. With a misstep possibly leading to fines and worse, the implications of unclear regulatory items are critical to push back against.

WOTUS may not be allowed to stand: the Supreme Court is currently deciding a case – Sackett v. EPA – that could potentially overturn this rule. GCSAA has argued that the EPA and Corps should wait until the Sackett decision before publishing this rule, i.e. "no WOTUS before SCOTUS." Until then, the rule is in place!

There is a very important question when dealing with surface water. Have you researched the watersheds at your golf facility? Yes, you may have been on property for a very long time, seen droughts and extremely wet conditions. You may even be aware of those areas that are typically wet and impossible to mow or maintain during the early spring that dry out fairly quickly and are easily mowed during the season. Perhaps swales were designed to assist your golf course remove surface waters during peak rainfall. Well, the government may indeed classify those as waterways under the WOTUS rule.

Rather than dealing with the many frustrating issues within the WOTUS rule, I'm hoping you have utilized the mapping tool through the United States Geological Survey (USGS).

As described on their website, the USGS was created by an act of Congress in 1879, the USGS provides science for a changing world, which reflects and responds to society's continuously evolving needs. As the science arm of the Department of the Interior, the USGS brings an array of earth, water, biological, and mapping data and expertise to bear in support of decision-making on environmental, resource, and public safety issues.

So while you may think you know your property best, what the USGS says about the surface water on your property is the only thing that matters! It may show wetlands where you may not realize, ephemeral streams where only dry swales exist, or connectivity between surface waters that are not evident.

#### **River Vale**

Architect Orrin Edward Smith designed and built River Vale. Orrin was a protégé of Donald Ross. He went to work for Donald Ross in 1919 and supervised the building of seven courses and assisted in the design and construction of several more.

In 1924, Smith branched out on his own designing and building golf courses. Smith designed and remodeled 40 courses during his career. He, like Ross, was a mentor for other upcoming architects in the business. Smith's protégé's include William Mitchell and Albert Zakorus.

There is some evidence that Ross and Smith collaborated on River Vale's design or, at the very least, Ross gave Smith some advice in laying out the course. River Vale opened in 1931 to positive reviews.

Here is Brian O'Malley's description of the course. "River Vale is not long, about 6500 yards from the tips. The



This is the link to the USGS mapping site:

Water Resources of the United States—National Water Information System (NWIS) Mapper (usgs.gov)

It allows you to enter an address or site that will bring you to your facility. After putting in your address, click on "Map" then at the bottom of that window on the left, "Base Map." For example, I chose a facility most of you would be aware of and a location that is hosting a HVGCSA event later this year, Wallkill Golf Club, and added the maps that populate below.



While you can see the pond on the property. When zooming in, it appears that pond is indeed separated, and if made for irrigation (I am unsure if that is the case), it would be exempt from the WOTUS rule if not connected to another waterbody.

By scrolling down and selecting "USGS National Map" in the base map options, the surface waters recognized by the USGS are developed, see below.

Of note here, the pond appears to be independent. That would be good news! The potential issue lies in those small blue water-loving plants noted across the property. Those denote wetlands. If

these wetland areas are viewed to create a connection of the ponds pictured, this becomes a real problem as this map would show a "significant nexus" (remember that potentially hazardous phrase from above) across the Wallkill property, to Lake Henneside, all the way to Dwaar Kill downstream. So.....want to add cart path material to the "wetlands" that passes across that area, or manage invasive weed species in or near that same area, a feder-

al permit may be needed. Change out a culvert pipe, federal permit. You see the issue for Wallkill? If the ponds and "wetland" area that connect them were deemed not to be WOTUS, then the facility would be dealing with the town, county, or state as needed. People with much greater knowledge of the property and understanding of the work to be done. No costly federal permit.

A few take-home messages for you. Take the opportunity to check out the



map of your facility. Learn what the USGS deems the surface water and wetlands to be at your facility. Understand how changes to WOTUS could affect the way you maintain your property, and advocate when given the chance!

## **BOARD OF DIRECTORS CORNER**

Hello Fellow Turf Industry Experts!



The winter is over, for the most part, and I'm sure everyone is gearing up their golf courses to open for the season. Some might be open already. Sales folk are routing and rerouting their weekly visits to see all of us grass growers and groomers to make their living. I could go

on and on about this topic like every year but I won't.

Instead, I would like to tell you about my very interesting offseason but a little backstory is necessary. Back in November of 2017, I found out that my left knee was arthritic and was basically bone on bone. I was also diagnosed with a disease called sarcoidosis. There are many forms of it and it can be in various body locations. Mine happens to be a very rare form unfortunately, which is located in my bones and joints. This can make movement very difficult, often painful, at times. There is no treatment for this auto-immune disease that I have, however steroids like prednisone do help but only provide temporary relief. It also doesn't help that I am allergic to steroids (go figure) and steroids also exacerbate Lyme disease, which I have been diagnosed with 5 times. I'm explaining this all because it does relate to my offseason.

Recently in October of 2022, I had a check up on my knee which at this point was diagnosed as "pretty bad" (5 years after finding out about how bad it was). It is believed that the sarcoidosis expedited my knee deteriorating. After several knee injections, and also having a brace designed specifically for my knee both failed to help, it was time for surgery. So on December 19<sup>th</sup> of 2022, I had a full left knee replacement at age 49.

As I write this article, I am still in the healing process. My knee still swells up and I am probably about 40% to 45% full strength, but I'm getting better week by week. I will say that it was and still is a very grueling process. Physical Therapy has been a lifesaver and gamechanger. I had my last appointment at the end of March, and then I'm on my own to continue the rehab.

I know that this article is different then the usual article at this time, but I wanted to share my experience with all of you that read this.

I'm very fortunate to have a wonderful and loving family there to help out. At work, I have the best Assistant I could ask for, that's always there, and incredibly understanding. (Thank you, Matt.) I have an awesome core crew that has returned now for a couple years. I belong to a great industry with a kickass association that is laid back but also knows how to dress up when needed. All this being said, I want to thank all of you for being there for me and I look forward to winning the comeback golfer of the year!!!
