

On Monday, April 15th, Beekman CC in Hopewell Junction, NY will host the HVGCSA for its first golf meeting of 2024. This will be a "Nine & Dine". Our host superintendent is Steve "Spoons" Spontak.

#### The Course and Other Stuff:

Beekman CC was the brainchild of Phil Shatz. Phil grew up on a farm in Carmel, NY during the Great Depression. As a naturalist, farming was close to his heart. He kept bees, goats and sheep, tapped maple trees, and brought back into production a 100-year-old apple orchard in La-Grange. Phil was many things in his long professional and personal career. He was a farmer, philanthropist, lawyer, banker, insurance broker, rock and ice climber, skier, and family man.

Phil acquired a bean farm in the late 1950's. It was there where he designed and built Beekman CC. One of his favorite stories was riding a bulldozer while telling his partner where to make the holes. Beekman CC opened in 1964 and eventually evolved into a 27-hole public golf property. The three 9-hole tracts are named the "Valley", the "Highland", and the "Taconic". Phil owned and operated the Beekman CC for 52 years.

In 2016, Beekman CC was sold to the Gresalfi family who own the 5<sup>th</sup> largest auto parts business in the United States. The family has long standing ties to the area. Grandmother Gertrude Gresalfi is a direct descendant of Henry Beekman, a Kingston native, who fought in the Revolutionary War and was a major land owner in Dutchess County. clubhouse and restaurant have been renovated and the food and beverage service is now run in-house. The food is excellent and the bar and restaurant is always packed. Steve says that a delicious dinner and much alcohol will be waiting for us after golf.

Beekman is known as a venue that caters to all levels of play which explains its great success as a golf destination over the years.



#### Spoon Man:

Steve was born in East Hempstead, NY but was raised in Mahopac. His first foray in the golf business was working on the summer crew at Mahopac CC. "I had a construction job that didn't work out," Steve recalled, "I was friends with Bob Stein-

man and he hired me to work for him on the crew at Putnam CC in the late eighties." In no time at all, Spoons was the crew foreman. When Bobby became the GM at the club, Steve followed him over to the clubhouse and became the facilities manager. In 1995, Spoons accompanied Bob to Beekman CC. He was the crew foreman for one year before becoming an assistant superintendent. In 2006, when Bob resigned his position, Spoons took over the reins of superintendent.

In 2023, Beekman did an amazing 70,000 rounds. The

"It was rough starting out but once I got my dog Clover everyone seemed to like me", Steve smiled. Besides maintaining the huge Beekman campus, there continue to be many in-house projects on the schedule. "We are still in the process of rebuilding bunkers, a task that has been going on forever," Steve laughed.

Normally Steve maintains a crew of 18-21 workers during the season but that can vary. The labor market for golf courses can get a little dicey with the improving economy.

In addition to his responsibilities to the club, Steve's family is where he finds his greatest happiness, that is, if he can stay awake long enough to enjoy his family after a tough day at the course. Married for 28 years to his wife Betsy, the Spontak brood includes son Steve Jr. age 26, and twin daughters Katherine and Rachel, age 23.

Steve looks forward to seeing all his HVGCSA brothers at the April meeting. Be sure to bring your sticks and your appetite!

Phoenix was a little different, actually a LOT different! The Northeast region dominated many of the headlines! In case you missed it, here are those who caught fire in Phoenix!

#### Col. John Morley:



William "Bill" Murray, retired superintendent and 27-year member of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA), has been named the recipient of the association's 2024 Col. John Morley Award.

Murray spent the final 26 years of his career in the seven-course Monmouth

County (N.J.) Park System before retiring in 2022. Prior to that the Lee, Mass. native spent time at courses in Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey.

"Bill is a prime example of what Col. John Morley stood for and what the Morley Award is all about," said GCSAA CEO Rhett Evans. "Throughout his long and successful career, he has given back so much to the profession through his service to his fellow GCSAA members on both the local and national level. He is truly worthy of the award, and we congratulate him."

#### Environmental Leaders in Golf

#### **Innovative Conservation Award**



Jim Pavonetti, CGCS-Fairview Country Club-Greenwich, Conn.

Jim Pavonetti, CGCS is a 28-year GCSAA member and has served as the golf course superintendent at Fairview Country Club in Greenwich, Conn. since 2008.


One of Pavonetti's environmental innovations involves the property's ponds. His use of barley straw and dye to create

clean ponds has reduced herbicide usage by 90 percent. His team uses a combination of air diffusers, black pond dye and the barley straw to reduce algae blooms. The limiting of inputs saved the club an average of \$9,000 per year and has reduced aquatic applications by more than 90 percent.

#### <u>Leo Feser Award</u>

A 28-year member of GCSAA, Pavonetti authored the story "Gold standards" that was published in the November 2022 issue of *GCM* <u>https://www.gcmonline.com/profession/ operations/news/gold-standards-best-maintenance-practices</u>. The story was originally published in the July 2022 edition of *Tee to Green*, the chapter publication for the Metropolitan GCSA, and was reprinted with permission in *GCM*. Pavonetti's story examined the practice of establishing formal maintenance standards for golf courses, how he went about doing that at his facility, and the lessons he learned throughout the process.

#### The Emerging Leader Award



Kremer completed his fourth season as the superintendent at Hop Meadow Country Club in Simsbury, Conn. in November after spending six years in two different stints as an assistant at the course. He graduated from the University of Connecticut in 2010.

The 37-year-old Kremer began his golf course maintenance career as an intern at Hop Meadow, while still a student at UConn. After two years as an assistant superintendent, Kremer left to be part of a landscaping company for four years. He then returned to Hop Meadow in 2016 and was promoted to superintendent in 2020.

Kremer has been very active at the chapter level where he presently serves as a board member of the Connecticut Association of Golf Course Superintendents (CAGCS). In addition to organizing winter seminars, he has helped grow the game by being the CAGCS representative to Connecticut's First Tee program.
