HVGCSA September Meeting & Met Team Qualifier

Hosted by Chris Kemble at McCann Memorial Golf Course

Tuesday, September 16th

The HVGCSA's next golf meeting will be held at McCann Memorial Golf Course in Poughkeepsie, NY on Tuesday, September 16th. Our host, Chris Kemble, is only the 3rd superintendent to hold to reins at McCann since the course opened in 1973. His predecessors, long time HVGCSA members Paul Buccellato and the late John Adriance, were well-loved and respected by their peers. It's a strong legacy that Chris continues.

The Golf Course: If you are wondering how the golf course got its name, wonder no further. James J. McCann was a local Poughkeepsie businessman who left a sizable estate to various charities upon his death to do good works. One of his wishes was for the construction of a municipal golf course. His wish was granted and the city of Poughkeepsie donated land for the project and construction began in 1969.

McCann was designed by architect William Mitchell and is noted for its large greens and narrow fairways. Mitchell left his mark in the Hudson Valley and Long Island, designing Tarry Brae, Putnam National, Otterkill, Woodcrest Club, and Pine Hollow to name a few. McCann was completed and scheduled to open in 1971 when, just prior to the grand opening, a tropical storm pounded the area and totally washed out a large part of the golf course. Repairs took more than a year to complete and the full 18-hole layout opened in 1973.



The McCann Foundation was set up to underwrite the course if it slipped into the red. McCann-Caven Golf Courses Inc. was created in 1975 as a regulatory body to oversee the proper operation of the course. Greens fees

for local residents are lower than for non-residents and to this day the course has not cost the taxpayers of Poughkeepsie a dime.

The course plays 6524 yards from the tips and par is 72. The par 3's on the course are not overly long and all of the par-5's are reachable in two for the big hitters, none measuring more than 471 yards from the white tees.

About Chris:



Chris began his golf maintenance career in 2000 working on the crew at Beekman CC. With Superintendent Bobby Steinman's encouragement, Chris developed a true fondness for his chosen profession. "Bobby influenced me to stay in the industry," Chris recalled, "he taught me about

the maintenance and operation of the golf course and took me to a lot of HVGCSA meetings. Bobby's innate skill as an agronomist was a huge help, he's one of the best." Bobby is currently working at McCann as Chris' assistant.

In 2006, Chris completed his 2-year degree at Rutgers University and became Bob's assistant. Chris remained at Beekman until the next important opportunity beckoned. In 2008 Chris decided to move on and took a position at Westchester CC for working for Joe Alonzi. "Joe taught me what it was like to operate in a private higher level golf environment. I learned about paying attention to the smallest details and budgets and the logistics of such a large operation. I gained a lot of valuable experience working for Joe".

In 2009, Chris was hired as the superintendent of Southern Dutchess GC in Beacon, NY. Chris fondly recalls, "I loved the work at Southern Dutchess because it was so hands-on. I had a really small crew. The membership was great and made me feel very welcome and secure. The members themselves would pitch in and help with projects and aeration. It was a real "blue collar" club."

In January of 2013, Chris moved north to become the superintendent of the McCann and College Hill golf



Golf slows down perhaps, recovery comes, projects get underway, and the season comes to a close. We get to review what worked and what did not work this past season and strategize for the next year. Speaking of this past season, it seemed it was very important where exactly you were located. IRRIGATION: A LOVE HATE RELATIONSHIP

Let me tell you—there's nothing quite like watching a couple of beautiful sprinklers throw water into the sunrise with just a few taps on your phone. But just as quickly, that peaceful moment can turn into chaos when a surprise geyser joins the show or a roque river appears somewhere on the course.

I'm lucky to have a modern computer central and a pumphouse station that's only a few years old. But my sprinkler and pipe system? It's original to the course—about 35 years old. It must've been something before electricity! That aging infrastructure adds a unique kind of stress to my job.

We're in the early stages of designing a new sprinkler system, but until then, I'm constantly monitoring and making repairs. And when I say repairs... well, sometimes they're more like creative solutions. I do my best to keep things top-notch, but when parts are scarce or time is tight, you do what you have to do.

One method I swear by: drilling out pinholes near valve boxes, using a self-tapping screw with a piece of old greens mower tire, sealing it with primer and glue, and driving it in with an impact. It's like filling a cavity—and it works. I've never had one fail.

Of course, there are the big jobs too. One of the toughest was replacing a valve box service with a T fitting and brass valve—at the lowest point on the course. With frozen or missing isolation valves, I had to drain the entire system. Another memorable repair was replacing a 30' section of mainline over a stream, complete with Schedule 80 fittings, thrust blocks, and a protective shroud made from drainage pipe and sacrete.

I'd love to hear about your own irrigation repairs -whether they were clever fixes you're not too proud of or major challenges you'll never forget. Let's keep sharing ideas and learning from each other.

Feel free to call, text, or just stop me next time you see me. September's here—time for aerators and falling leaves!
