

On Wednesday, June 26th, Wiltwyck Golf Club and Superintendent Jason Nalepa will host the HVGCSA's June meeting and qualifier for this year's Met Team Championship. It is the third golf meeting of 2024 and we are looking forward to a huge turnout. It will also be a great opportunity to support Wiltwyck GC. The club's comeback is truly a testament to the resiliency of the members who purchased the property and just refused to let it fail.

The Town

Wiltwyck's home town, Kingston, has a long and storied history. Originally, the town was named Esopus after a local Indian tribe. It was one of the original Dutch settlements in New Netherland, the others being Beverwyck and Manhattan Island. In 1777, Kingston became the first capital of New York State. During the Revolutionary War, the city was torched by British troops moving up the Hudson River from New York City. Kingston was home to a major granary that supplied grain to the colonies. The British burned the entire city to the ground along with large stores of wheat. For the life of me, I can't figure out how one would burn wheat but obviously, the British were good at it. During the 1800's Kingston

was a hub for the production of bluestone and cement, having both cement deposits and the native river sand used in the production of bluestone. Other industries prevalent at that time were ice harvesting from the Hudson and numerous brick making factories. Alas, none of those industries survived to the present day. But, thankfully, there are still a lot of great watering holes down on the banks of Rondout Creek.

The Course

In 1933, a group of local businessmen culminated two years of discussion by forming a golf club. They named it "Wiltwyck," Dutch for "wild refuge," the name given to the area by Dutch Governor Peter Stuyvesant nearly 300 years earlier.

The new club purchased an estate on the western outskirts of Kingston. Construction of a nine-hole course began in late 1933 and the course opened for play in 1934. In the early 1950's, the NYS Thruway was routed through the heart of the course so the move was made to a 140-acre farm half a mile south from the original site. Robert Trent Jones Sr. was

Winding Hills GC To Host the HVGCSA's July Meeting



On Monday July 22nd, Winding Hills and Superintendent Steve Bartro will host the HVGCSA's July meeting. This will be a unique event. It's a Nine & Dine but you'll be playing 18 holes. Go figure. Winding Hills is an Executive Golf Course. That means our Hudson Valley brotherhood will get to play an interesting layout with lots of short holes. So, keep those drivers in the bag!

The Course:

Winding Hills was built in the late 1990's. It is modeled after Geoffrey Cornish's Blue Rock GC at Yarmouth, MA in Cape Cod. The layout features fifteen par 3 and three par 4 holes and plays 2595 yards in total. The course is semi-private and open to the public. The owners have been developing the property and building houses so if you buy a house there, you're a member. The course is a lot of fun to play. Don't go there and think that it'll be a breeze. There's a lot of trouble bordering each hole so if you don't hit it straight you could be in trouble. If you plan on imbibing while you play, bring a couple of sleeves of golf balls. You'll need them.

Our Host:



Our host, Steve Bartro, was born in Morristown, NJ. And he's moved more than any man on the planet. Steve is our modern-day Jack Kerouac, author of "On the Road". "I've moved more than 40 times is my short life," Steve laughed, "my parents got divorced when I was a

young guy. I've lived in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, Florida, Nevada, and California. I know I left a few states out. I went to four different high schools. I know a lot of people from a lot of different places."

Steve's first foray into the world of golf course maintenance was at River Bend Golf Club in Ormond Beach, FL. "I was 19 when I started," Steve said, "It was just a job on the crew but I learned all the basics."

Two years later, Steve began work at Redwood Canyon GC in Castro Valley, CA. "I was at Redwood Canyon for 8 years," Steve said, "within a year I was the first assistant. I might as well have been the superintendent. My boss had substance abuse issues and wasn't very reliable. So, I had to cover for him a lot. I really learned my craft working there. The only thing we didn't do there was spray. It was an Audubon Sanctuary." There was a happy ending to this story. His boss got treatment and is currently working in the business as a superintendent.

In 2020, Steve moved on as an assistant to Glenbrook Golf Club in Glenbrook, NV. Glenbrook is a high-end private club in the Lake Tahoe area. Steve was only there for a season.

In 2021, Steve took over the reins at Winding Hills. This is his ${\bf 4}^{\rm th}$ year managing the club.

Steve lives in Walden, NY with his partner Rochelle. They met in middle school in Port Jervis. They have four children, daughter Brehnna-15, son Cody-7, daughter Bella-4, and son Levi-3. Sounds like Steve has put roots down and won't have to move for the 41st time, at least not in the near future.

hired to build an 18-hole championship course which was ready to play in 1956.

Wiltwyck is a parkland course complete with numerous elevation changes and water in play on four holes. The greens are small and well bunkered. Like all RTJ's courses, Wiltwyck has great bones. It plays 6850 yards from the championship tees.

Our Host

Our host, Jason Nalepa, was born and raised in Kingston. In 2000, Jason began working on the maintenance crew at Wiltwyck for Paul Pritchard. In the fall of 2001, with Paul's urging, Jason signed up for the turf program at SUNY Delhi. "I attended Delhi from 2001-2004", and I commuted from Kingston which was an hour and twenty minutes each way", Jason laughed, "that enabled me to keep working part time at the course." In 2004, Jason received his associate's degree.

In 2004, Jason began working full time at the course and soon moved into the role of 2^{nd} assistant. In 2016 with the club struggling financially, Paul was let go and Jason was asked to move into the role of superintendent, which he refused. The club miraculously stayed open and, in 2017, Ben Babbage was hired as superintendent. Jason stayed on as Ben's 1^{st} assistant.

Towards the end of the 2017 season, Wilwyck, in receivership with a local bank, decided to close its doors. Ben moved on and Jason was left to ponder his future. Miraculously, WGC Holdings, a buying group which included 12 Wiltwyck members, stepped in and bought the property from the bank.

"Six managing members from WGC Holdings make all the decisions at the course," Jason reported, "all of the department heads report directly to the managing members. We meet face-to-face once a month. WGC has invested a lot of money into the property. There were clubhouse improvements. The bar, restaurant, and banquet area were completely gutted and renovated. A new swimming pool was built. We have a new pump house, new tennis courts, new irrigation controls systems, and some new equipment. This year, a complete renovation of the patio area was completed. It's beautiful. We have big screen TV's and new canopies for protection from the sun. I can't wait to show that off."

Architect Brian Silva was retained to develop a master plan for the golf course. "When Brian first walked the course, he said he wouldn't take the job unless extensive tree removal was a priority. Two winters ago, mother nature took care of about ½ of the job," Jason laughed, "We had a major ice storm on February 4th. The inch of ice mangled over 200 trees. They were beyond saving. We had a crew of 15 here for almost a month removing the trees and grinding up all the stumps. The membership love it. It really opened up the course. We recently did an in-house facelift on all the bunkers. We brought them back to their original footprint, replaced the sand, and edged them. They look great."

So, there you have it. We look forward to seeing you on June 26th.


